Sit with the facts

- Up to 85% of women on psychiatric wards are survivors of childhood sexual abuse cf 30% in the population
- Black people are 4-7 times more likely to be detained than the average
- Lesbians, gay men are more likely bisexual people to attempt to take their lives – 20-40% cf 4.4%
- Hate crimes for 2017/18 were up 17% on previous year

Consider the ethical use of power

•Focus on the responsibility that comes with power (with great power comes great responsibility)

- Develop a strong moral identity
- Encourage others to voice
- Find mentors to keep you humble
